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ACADEMY APPLICATION

The Full Governing Body met on 29 March, 2011 and decided unanimously to apply for Academy status in conjunction with other Huntingdonshire Secondary Schools.

The Governing Body believes this change in status brings the following advantages:

- 1 It will provide an excellent way forward to work in partnership with schools currently in the Huntingdonshire consortium. This exchange of expertise and joint working could be very beneficial to our students (eg with curriculum development).
- 2 We can also look forward to increased choice and purchasing power as a Consortium when sourcing goods and services.
- 3 The change in status presents a timely opportunity for the seven secondary schools in Huntingdonshire to rework their relationship with the Local Authority. Senior Local Authority officers have been very positive about this move and look forward to discussing ways we might work effectively together.
- 4 In due course the curriculum freedom will give us opportunities to be innovative in our approach. For example, our main aim in KS3 is to produce good learners by the end of Year 9, the freedoms we obtain could be beneficial in this though we would always offer a broad and balanced curriculum.
- 5 The extra control of our funding will enable us to enhance opportunities for our students. It will also help us to protect the current curriculum experience during a time of budget cuts and falling rolls.

In summary, the Governing Body feels that achieving Academy status will maximise our ability to plan strategically for sustained improvement in the coming years.

The application process will now take a minimum of three months. I will keep you informed of developments as they happen.

National Healthy School Award

We are pleased to announce that St Ivo have been awarded National Healthy School status. The award was given in recognition of the school promoting the health and wellbeing of staff and students, enabling them to make healthy lifestyle choices.

The school has been able to provide a range of evidence which clearly demonstrates the progress the school has made in the last few years. The Dining Hall has become an area where students and staff can enjoy a fresh, locally-sourced and healthy menu. Alongside this, new vending machines are available with healthy snacks, and water coolers are situated around all areas of the school. Students in the most recent surveys quite clearly understand what a healthy diet is.

We were also pleased to record high levels of participation in physical activity outside of PE lessons, with 98% of students surveyed saying that they exercised hard at least once a week. Also the vast majority of students said that they enjoyed physical activities that were on offer.

Our PSHE curriculum and the way which the school supports emotional health and wellbeing were also recognised in being awarded Healthy Schools status.

Geography Department News

After the success of the department's visit to South Africa in October we are continuing our links with the Mbuyisa -Makhubu Primary school in Soweto. It is a very typical South African school with all the associated problems and challenges that are sadly typical of a township school. We were made incredibly welcome however by both staff and pupils and our hopes are to return there in the not too distant future. Letters with details of the proposed October 2012 visit have recently been made available.



A number of field trips are currently being planned for the summer term - letters will be online and handed out for the **ever popular Year 8 trip to Stibbington where students get a 'hands on' experience of river fieldwork. Year 9 also have the opportunity to do a coastal study at Dunwich in June. In June Year 7 geography students have a 'Japan Week'** where they learn about the social, physical and cultural geography of the country with a range of outside speakers running a variety of workshops. They will also have chance to visit the Eco house in St Ives as part of their work on sustainable energy.

Year 12 geographers are off to Snowdonia for their annual fieldtrip next week, while after Easter the Chief Examiner from AQA is coming to run workshops for both Year 12 and 13 in preparation for their module exams in the summer.

Year 10 geographers are off to Iceland in the summer term and they, like Year 11, are continuing to make full use of the **revision resources that are available on the department's web site www.geobytesgcse.wordpress.com**



All of the geography department has been involved in the recent Fair Trade fortnight as well as involving **students in making pledges to mark 'Climate Week'** . This is part of the Eco-Ivo initiative run by Mrs Morey and the Eco-Ivo committee.

Students drew fascinating parallels with the 'credit crunch' and banking crisis facing the world today.

Year 10

Students should be congratulated for working very hard on their GCSE Controlled Assessment on Britain in the 'Swinging Sixties'. They have also recently been studying the USA 1945-70 about the Red Scare and Black Civil Rights Movement, and are revising for their Year 10 exams.

Well done to Year 11 who are still working hard towards their GCSE examinations. The Chief Examiner for History from Edexcel came in during March to deliver a valuable revision workshop. Booster sessions still run every Wednesday (USA & International Relations) and Thursday (Russia re-takes) in the department from 3pm-345pm.

Year 12

Year 12 Students and staff found the department's first trip to Berlin enjoyable and invaluable. It was linked to the new AS module: Germany 1933-63. The tour included Brandenburg Gate, Potsdamer Platz, Goring's Air Ministry, Topography of Terror (former SS and Gestapo HQ), Neue Synagogue, and northern Mitte (a preserved pre-war Jewish area), Sachsenhausen Concentration camp, the stadium built by the Nazis for the 1936 Olympic Games, and Wannsee Villa where the 1942 conference decided upon the 'Final Solution' against the Jews.

Year 13 are working hard towards their A2 examinations. The deadline for coursework on Russia is 26th April 2011.

Students in Year 8 have been busy learning Spanish with Miss Jimenez after school on Mondays and students have just completed their ASSET examinations in listening and reading. On Monday, 28th March, students celebrated their successful conclusion of the course with the presentation of certificates from the Language Centre at Cambridge University by Mrs Meadowcroft.

Students in Year 9 have recently completed their course in Italian with Mrs Champley-Potter after school on Thursdays and are now ready to be able to cope with a short tourist visit to Italy.

In January, in the "Talk the Talk" event Year 9 students looked at careers with languages and explored the advantages offered by studying a language. They also tasted a variety of languages which were new to them. Later in the term, a group of Year 9 students tried out their French and German in the department's mock towns where students particularly enjoyed purchasing animals and edibles. We were delighted with the efforts students made to communicate with the native and near native speakers who kindly joined us to act as shopkeepers and stall-holders.

Year 10 students have been participating in the very successful first leg of the exchange with a school in Stadthallen-dorf and students wish me to pass on their thanks to Mrs Meadowcroft and Mrs Scally as well as Frau Gampe and her colleagues in the German school for all their efforts to make the visit so enjoyable. The return visit to Germany takes place in May.

Able, gifted and talented students in Year 10 have now completed their challenge to gain a successful result in Latin in 20 hours. With some students gaining 19 or 20 out of 20 on one of the papers I think we can conclude that the students have done very well indeed.

Year 11 students in French, German and Italian have spent more time with us out of the main school day than any other year group in the Spring Term and we have been impressed by their determination to improve upon their writing and speaking marks. In addition to workshops and Saturday events students attended sessions each week for students wanting to stay behind and produce more written work. It is very pleasing to see how many students have improved during the past 10 school weeks and we congratulated them on their superb efforts. If grades were given for effort and endurance in modern languages this year group would gain more A*s than any previous Year 11 cohort.

For the past 6 months two teams of Young Enterprise students at St Ivo School have been hard at work running their own businesses by designing, building, promoting and selling their products in the local area.

Design & Technology Department News

Success for St Ivo Design and Technology team.

On Wednesday 9th February we took three teams consisting of four students in each to Ramsey College to compete in the Huntingdon Rotary Club technology tournament. On the day the teams were set a very challenging brief which involved retrieving and lifting a cylinder, after moving along a track and under a bridge using a remote lifting mechanism from one metre away. The solution had to be designed and made in four hours using basic equipment and supplied resources which included sections of wood, a motor, wheels and pulleys.

The students were most resourceful and were watched throughout the challenge by judges from industry who were assessing design ideas, construction techniques, feasibility of success with design and teamwork.

We had a Year 8 team in the basic challenge up against Year 9 teams from other schools, and two Year 10 teams from our GCSE groups in the intermediate challenge. All students found the day and the challenge difficult but enjoyable and one of the intermediate teams were indeed successful in winning the trophy for their efforts on the day.

Students who should be congratulated for taking part are from Year 8 Connor, Ross, James and Niall. In Year 10 one team consisted of Joe, Oliver, Ross and Maddison.

The team that were crowned champions in the intermediate category this year were Jordan, Rebecca, Terry and Bethany.

This other school near Peshawar was devastated in the floods last year. We are looking to sponsor a teacher and provide a bursary for one of the students affected by the floods. Fund raising for major global events helps to broaden the perspective of the students at St Ivo and allow them to empathise with children facing devastating problems in other parts of the world.
