“Aladdin”

As part of the 50th Anniversary celebrations, St Ivo School put on a performance of the pantomime “Aladdin” on Tue 13th and Wed 14th December in the school Hall. “Aladdin” was the first pantomime put on at the school in the late 1950s and this year’s pantomime, specially written for the anniversary celebrations by a member of the school drama department, is a tribute to the school’s many years of success in the performing arts.

The cast and crew represent all years at St Ivo, part of the ethos of inclusion at the school. The script was written by Nick Perry, a teacher at the school for more than sixteen years: “I cobbled the script together from memories of other productions I had seen but tried to be as true to the original story as I could. A pantomime wouldn’t be what it is without the inevitable corny puns and audience participation and there is plenty of that for all to enjoy. The songs are all original and written especially for the

show and range from sentimental ballads to thumping chorus numbers. This is my fifth pantomime for St Ivo and we are blessed with a very strong cast.”



The production involved a huge number of staff and students in many areas of the school - prop making, set-designing, costumes, make-up, choreography and direction and led by a very strong cast.

The evening included free refreshments and donations were accepted to Crisis - a charity for the homeless.

Design and Technology News

The design department took thirty students to London for the day. We visited the Design Museum, where students looked at one of their product collections. The activity was well structured and students were encouraged to draw and identify the working properties of the lighting collection. The collection was very interesting ranging from a 1960's desk lamp produced from sheet steel with a stove enamel finish, to a polycarbonate light in a block with tilt switch sensors and colourful LEDs. The current exhibition was about the life and work of Eileen Gray an architect whose work influenced both Art Deco design and the Modern Movement.

From there we visited the Science Museum and listened to Dr Sue Mossman who explained to us about the sustainable materials collection. The students had the opportunity to interact with the displays as well as gather useful information from the experts at the museum. All in all, apart from the long coach trip it was a very informative day. Thank you to all of the students and staff that took part.

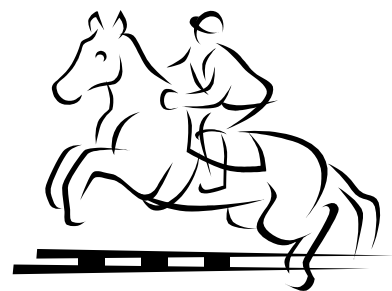


More Sports News
