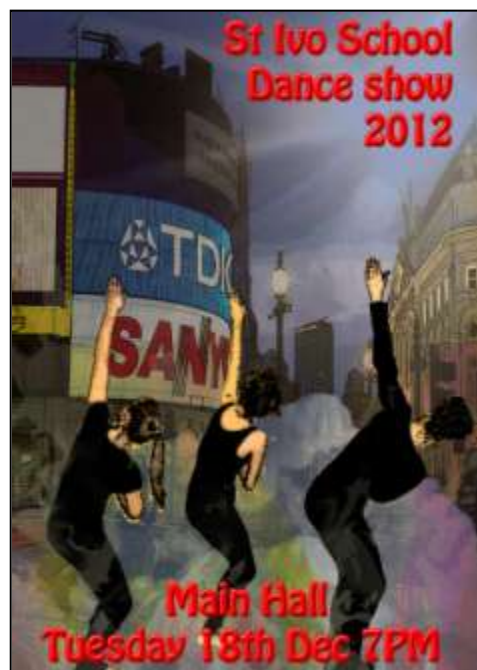

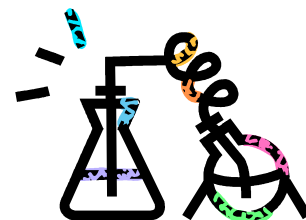

Science Dept News



The science department has been busy this term, with a variety of activities for students in all year groups. This year saw the first ever national Biology week and the sixth form BIO-IVO group planned a whole week of events to show the diversity of topics that Biology covers.

Monday saw balloon model microbes, while on Tuesday students made DNA bracelets. Wednesday was dissection day, with hearts, livers, kidneys and a 'pluck' (the tongue, oesophagus, lungs, heart and kidneys of an animal still attached to each other) put under the knife to show how our organs work. On Thursday we found out how fit and healthy we all were on physiology day, with heart rate monitors and lung capacity measurements amongst other things. The week ended with key stage 3 students pretending to be penguins and transporting their own 'eggs' (a football) on their feet to keep them off the ice.

Every week sees the Medical Committee meeting to discuss the application process for students in the sixth form who wish to study any of the biomedical sciences at university. Year 13 students have been offering advice to those in Year 12 who are just starting to look at their options. In addition we've had a lively debate on the ethics of abortion and discussed the latest biomedical stories that have been in the news. All of this helps prepare students for the university interviews which Year 13 are starting to attend right now.

Year 13 chemists have also been visiting Cambridge University to learn more about analytical chemistry and see the machines from their lessons in real life. The day was a great success, and they are now able to tell their HPLC from their GC-MS.

Finally key stage 3 students are welcome to Science Club every Thursday in S01 where so far this year we have grown crystals, made our own batteries from aluminium foil and copper coins and put out fires with home-made fire extinguishers.

Shoebox Appeal

Year 8 students have supported the Samaritans Purse Operation Christmas Child shoebox appeal for the fourth year running. The response again was fantastic, and means that the school has donated well over 800 boxes over the last four years. We would like to thank all the students, parents and staff who have supported this charity with its aim to make children's lives better in some of the poorest areas of the world.

History Dept News

Year 7

Year 7 showed great effort and enthusiasm in the Medieval castles and weapons competition. Models were built across all categories including Motte and Bailey castles, Stone square Keep castles, cake castles, siege towers, battering rams, catapults, and imaginative designs. Winners will be announced after Christmas. Furthermore, as part of the History Department's community link with St. Ives, the winning models will be displayed in the town library, and then transferred to the Norris Museum.



Year 8

Year 8 have been studying the English Civil War. Furthermore, they recently took part in a 'know your town' homework competition. Winners and prizes will be announced in assembly.

Year 9

Many students have shown excellent effort in producing high quality assessment essays on: 'Why did World War I break out in 1914?' The history department also visited the Somme battlefields on Friday 9th November. The visit involved 4 coaches of 160 Year 9 students and staff. The trip is linked to the study of the First World War in Year 9 lessons. A number of key places were visited including Vimy Ridge, Newfoundland Park, a large British cemetery at Serre, and Lochnagar Crater. At the Thiepval Memorial to the 73,000 missing British soldiers, St Ivo students gathered and took part in a moving ceremony. A poem was read, a wreath laid, the 'Last Post' was played by Stanley (Year 9), and a one minute silence was observed.



Year 10

Students should be congratulated for working very hard on their new GCSE courses. Their study of Russia has just been completed.

Year 11

Well done to Year 11 who are still working hard towards their GCSE examinations. They have just finished their mock exam on international Relations, which includes the study of the Cuban Missiles Crisis in 1962.

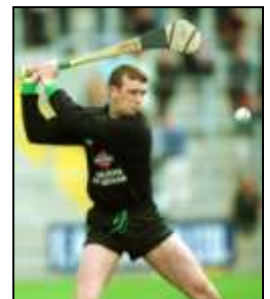


Year 12

Year 12 Students will soon be travelling to Berlin as part of their AS module: Germany 1933-63. The tour includes Brandenburg Gate, Potsdamer Platz, Goring's Air Ministry, Topography of Terror (former SS and Gestapo HQ), Neue Synagogue, and northern Mitte (a preserved pre-war Jewish area), Sachsenhausen Concentration camp, the stadium built by the Nazis for the 1936 Olympic Games, and Wansee Villa where the 1942 conference decided upon the 'Final Solution' against the Jews.

Year 13

Year 13 are working hard towards their A2 coursework on Russia. Some students also took part in a 4 day trip to Dublin as part of their study of Ireland 1798-1921. The trip involved visits to historic and cultural places such as Trinity College and the Book of Kells, Dublin Castle, the former Grattan Parliament, a 1916 walking tour, the GPO (for the 1916 Easter Rising), Kilmainham Gaol, Glasnevin cemetery, Croke Park Gaelic sports stadium, and the world famous bog bodies at the National Museum. Other popular activities included the literary and musical tours during the evenings. Overall, students found the trip highly useful for their historical studies, and great fun.

Friday – Whole school Non Uniform Day.

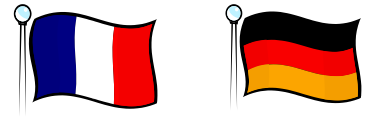
Other events that took place throughout the school at various times included a talent show and selling of handmade Pudsey goods including pom poms, key rings and mobile charms.

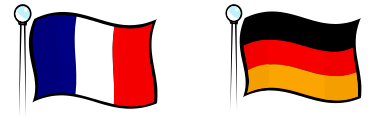
Year 9 – Masterclasses in European festivities!

Girls National Cup football success

St Ivo entered both the u13 and u16 girls teams into the national cup this year. It is the first time that the girls have entered this national football competition. Hundreds of schools enter the competition and after each knock out game the winning team progress to the next round. The u13 team managed to get through to the 5th round of the competition, meaning that they were in the last 32 schools of the country, narrowly being beaten at home by Copleston High School from Ipswich. The team is a mixture of Year 7 and 8 girls who have worked well together as a team for the first time and hopefully now will progress further in the same competition in years to come.



Our u16 team is a mixture of Year 10 and 11 girls; they are still in the competition and have managed to get to round 7. We are currently waiting to play in the quarter finals of the country, meaning that they have made it into the last 8 school teams. Their last game could not have been closer against Bungay High school away in Lowestoft. The game ended 3 -3 at full time and no goals scored after added extra time meant that they had to go to penalties. Penalties also ended 3 -3 so they had to go to sudden death. It was a nerve racking end to a well fought game with Player of the Match Chloe saving the opposition's last penalty to give St Ivo the win.
