HOURS OF WORK: **Part-time (15 hours, 39 weeks) (Monday – Friday 12.00pm – 3.00pm)**

RESPONSIBLE TO: **Catering Managers**

Job Purpose

To help to keep a calm and enjoyable atmosphere for students and staff in the eating areas
To work as part of a team to maintain a clean and hygienic dining hall.

Main Responsibilities

- To maintain a professional and friendly image with the clients and customers
- Undertake all basic training (including Basic Food Hygiene and COSHH)
- To make sure the tables are cleared by the students
- During lunchtime all tables must be wiped and cleaned after any students have moved away
- To clean all tables and chairs after service has finished
- To empty the bins in the dining hall when required
- After service the floor must be swept and mopped. Special care to be given to not putting too much water on the vinyl surface.
- Assist with other cleaning in the dining hall as requested (ie windows, sills, vending machines).
- Follow the correct hygiene and cleaning procedures to ensure high standards of dining hall area and personal hygiene are maintained

- Have a 'can do' attitude and be prepared to help out the rest of the team in a willing and positive manner
