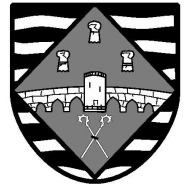

# Ecology News

As part of our A2 ecology module, our class has been involved in the Big School Bird Watch run by the RSPB. The survey is in order to monitor bird populations in the UK to compare changes in numbers over time. The reason for this is the worry over the rapid decrease in numbers over recent years. We observed and recorded the maximum number of each species we saw in different sites around the school. We found that the school gardens and the hedges surrounding the basketball courts was where the largest variety of birds was found. Overall we saw 14 different species with the most common being the black headed gull followed by blackbirds. Whereas the more unusual species found were the goldfinch and wren.

We hope that our results will be of help to the RSPB and useful in further conservation of British Birds.

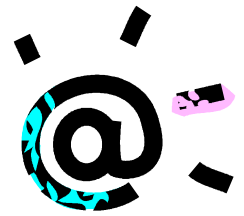
