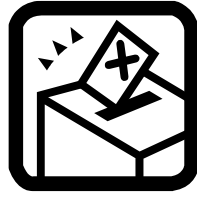

To help them with their decision each of the candidates for the Huntingdon Constituency was invited to address the students. For four lunchtimes Jonathan Djanogly (Conservative), Steven Sartain (Labour), Derek Norman (UKIP) and Julian Huppert (Liberal Democrat), attended a question and answer session. On May 5th sixth formers were asked to vote for their preferred candidate, and in a tight race the Liberal Democrat representative won. High quality student questions also impressed the candidates.

Deposits are currently being taken for the French trip for Year 8 pupils in October 2005 (n.b. the pupils concerned are now in year 7).

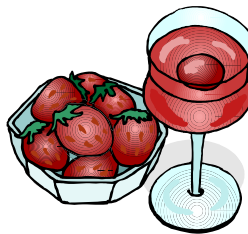
