As I write this the examination season has just started for Year 11 and is about to start for Years 12 and 13. Good luck to all of you with sons/daughters involved in exams this summer and I hope that it will be a successful time for them.

Over the last few months it has been exciting to plan for September and our designation as a Humanities College. The extra funding has enabled us to reduce class sizes for year 7 next year, invest in more ICT equipment and training and to appoint three 'Advanced Skills Teachers' who will work with colleagues to incorporate best practice into schemes of work. I am delighted with our achievement in gaining Specialist Humanities College status and feel that it will make a significant difference to pupil experience and outcomes.

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Modern Foreign Languages Department News

'Abroad' comes to St Ivo

Every language teacher knows that ultimately the best way to learn a language is to go and use it 'for real', but it is simply not practicable for every pupil to spend some time abroad in preparation for their exams. The language department has therefore tried to bring a touch of 'abroad' to the Ivo by offering every year 11 pupil of French, German and Spanish the chance to participate in a special, extended, experience beyond the classroom. Surrounded by adults who apparently couldn't speak any English, pupils had to put their language skills to good use to carry out various activities. The initial apprehension may have been palpable, but the sense of achievement and increased confidence afterwards far outweighed early reservations.

Pupil and staff feedback for the special events has all been so positive that we hope to repeat the opportunity each year in the run-up to the speaking examinations.

Stadtallendorf exchange 2008 - 2009

This is a 6 day exchange, open to year 10 pupils taking German GCSE. On each leg of the exchange there is an organised programme of visits, school lessons and social activities. A letter will be circulated next half term, once dates have been agreed with our partner school.

Schwalmtal exchange 2008 - 2009

This is an 8 day exchange, open to pupils of German in years 11, 12 and 13. Sixth formers undertake a 5-day work placement in Germany while year 11s have a programme of German tuition, time in school with their partners and cultural visits, including Cologne and Bonn. On their return visit all German pupils do a 5-day work experience. Informal social activities are organised privately for the evenings and weekend. Once dates are finalised a letter should be circulated, hopefully before the current year 10 start their work experience in July.

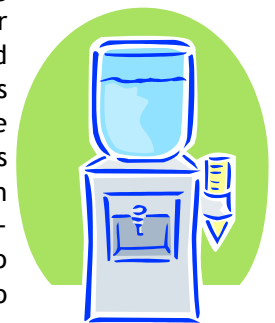

- Sanitation

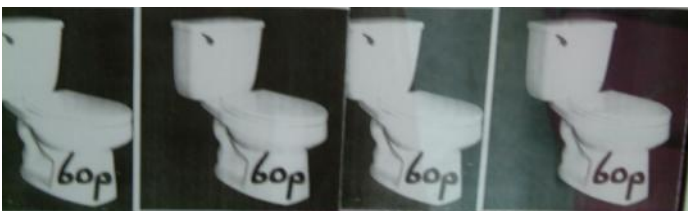
For 60 pence a dry covered latrine helps each family gain a healthier lifestyle. We take this for granted but year 9 collected enough to buy 150 latrines (£90).

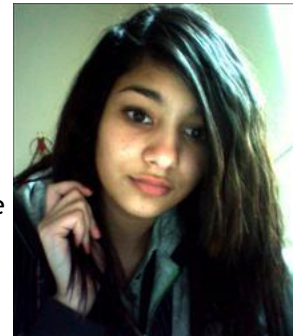

Blue Vision Twirlers

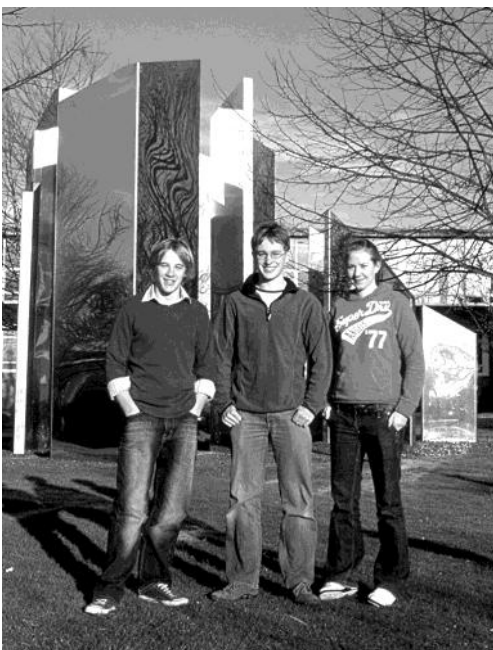

Spare seats for purchase on School Buses

Under Cambridgeshire's Home to School Transport Policy, pupils who are not eligible for free transport may be allowed to pay to travel on existing buses contracted to the County Council, if seats are available.



The current cost is £110 a term for a return journey ticket or £55 for a one-way journey. If families meet certain low income criteria a reduced charge of £70 a term is applicable. This represents excellent value, equating to £1.73 (£1.10 low income rate) per day when averaged out over the school year.

Seats are available on a termly or half-termly, 'first come, first served' basis. Please note that buses cannot deviate from their existing routes/timetables.

Parents can apply now to purchase spare seats for the summer term 2008.
