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Dear Parents and Carers

It has been an exceptionally busy start to 2018 here at St Ivo. Governors News

In my introductory email in November I explained that the St Ivo Governing Body was considering whether St Ivo School should become part of a multi-academy trust (MAT) and if so, which one. The Government has made it clear that not only does it want all schools to be part of multi-academy trusts, but that it sees the future being in medium-to-large MATs of perhaps ten or more schools.

St Ivo is one of the few academies in the county that is not part of a MAT. As a school that was rated 'Good' at last inspection by Ofsted, we are not under immediate pressure to join a MAT. However certain government funding is only available to MATs and it has to be recognised that the vast majority of the country's best-performing state funded schools are within MATs.

The potential advantages of St Ivo School joining a MAT could be considerable, but we need to find the right one. We need to be assured that joining a MAT would bring not just short-term benefits but guarantee the long-term success of the school while ensuring it retains its strong community focus.

Last week the governors met and agreed a long-list of **eight MATs, including Hinchingsbrooke School's ACES MAT**, who we have approached to see if they are interested in further discussions. We have asked each of them to provide us with their thoughts on how St Ivo joining their MAT would benefit our school and our stakeholders. Improving the outcomes and learning experience of students remains our main goal.

The governors will meet again at the end of February to review the responses we have had and agree a short-list of two or three, with whom we will then have more in-depth discussions.

As I have said before, we are open-minded about where this may lead. The case for joining, or not joining, a MAT will become clear during this process. I know I speak for my fellow governors when I say that we are not **only looking for a MAT that is right 'on paper', but one that represents the right fit with the school and provides us a genuine opportunity to improve and add value to our students learning.**

Please be assured that staff and parents will have ample opportunities to find out more about what is being proposed and to have their say before any decisions are made.

Geography News

Year 12 Changing Spaces, Making Places Fieldwork - London



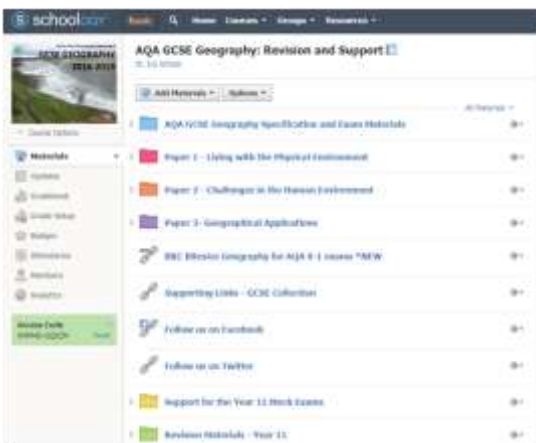
As part of the A Level course, Year 12 geographers have looked at the changing face of London as a result of globalisation. In December, students visited Canary Wharf to see how the area has transformed to become a global financial centre and the impact that this has had on the people and place. Students visited the Museum of London Docklands and also had their first attempt of collecting primary data -including questionnaires and estate agent surveys. After a lunch stop at the Westfield Centre, students visited the Olympic Park in Stratford to see the impact that the London Olympics have had on the area. Here, students practiced and consolidated their data collection techniques to understand the transformation that has taken place. Students have since used this data to complete their own mini-projects on London which are coming along really well. Students will have further opportunity to develop their qualitative and quantitative data collection methods on the Snowdonia trip next month.



Year 11 Revision

As we reach February half term, are at the start of the main preparations for the final exams in May/June. Thorough revision, backed up with practise of past papers is key to student success. Our extensive revision programme has already started running every other Thursday (please see figure to the right). New Book Titles – Pop into the RC at lunch to see book trailers and check out our new stock.

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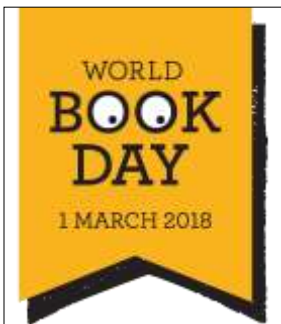

Life in Pompeii and Herculaneum at school on Saturday, 3rd March

We are offering an illustrated talk on Herculaneum and Pompeii at school on Saturday 3rd March. All are welcome: adults and students. Children who are under 16 who do not attend St Ivo School will need to be accompanied by an adult but are most welcome. There is no charge for this session in the ACL programme at St Ivo so all adults can come along.

During the first half an hour we will focus on Herculaneum to give details to those visiting the site in the summer ideas about what to look out for on a short visit. We will look at how to navigate and understand the site and what you will not want to miss. St Ivo students who attend this talk are welcome to leave after the talk on Herculaneum if they prefer not to stay for the talk about Pompeii.

We will then move to information and views of the larger site at Pompeii and focus on the development of the site from its earliest beginnings to key parts of the site (the ancient equivalent of the Rec Centre, fast food in the ancient world, the theatre, the amphitheatre, the baths including the Stabian Baths, various houses including the House of the Faun).
