Congratulations to all those students in year 10 who were presented with Languages' Ladder certificates in French preliminary or Spanish breakthrough in listening and/or reading by Dr Lid King, the national director of languages in the UK, on Thursday, 6th October in the year 10 assembly. Dr King explained to pupils that a knowledge of other languages is essential for a wide range of careers and could enrich people in their personal lives. The pupils receiving the certificates were those who had participated not only in the pilot for the Junior Cambridge University Language Programme last year but also in the pilot for the Languages' Ladder. The pupils sitting the tests have already reached the standard expected at (early stages of) GCSE, Dr King explained to the pupils.



This year, too, in our own pilot, selected pupils in years 9 and 10 at school will be invited to take tests in the languages' ladder, a nationally recognised set of awards available from September 2005 in primary, secondary and adult versions of 8 languages so far (with more to follow). Candidates can take tests in any one or more of the four skills (listening, reading, writing and speaking).

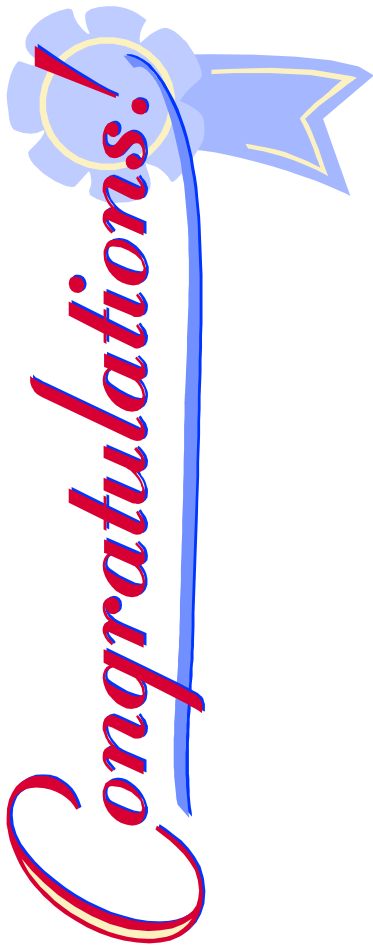

Hannah in year 12 won 2nd prize in this years NADFAS Regional Art competition.

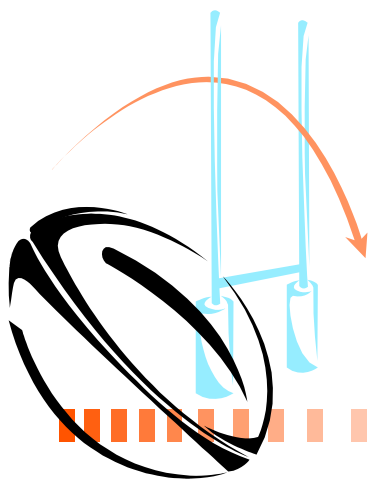
Hannah (9Pa) was selected in September for the Norwich City Football Club Girl's Centre of Excellence.

The team now compete in the Daily Mail Vase – we look forward to our first fixture. Well Done.

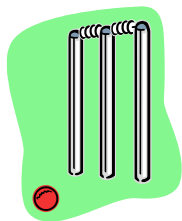
