

Year 11 Homework Timetable

Subjects set one homework per week, with the following exceptions:

- Art, Sculpture and Textiles – homework is a continuation of project work, and not stand alone tasks. Approx one hour a week.
- Business Studies, Economics and Cambridge National Business – one homework will be set per fortnight.
- Catering: homework is set once a week for completion within 7 days. In addition, homework will also include research and preparation for the 2 controlled practical assessments in September/October and January/February.
- Child Development: homework is set once a week for completion within 7 days. Homework for most of Year 11 is based upon the completion of the child study which is set in September for completion in March.
- Computing – arrangements differ depending on the course(s) being studied:
 - Cambridge Nationals option course - no regular homework set but a requirement to attend Improvement/catch up lessons if needed as coursework must be completed under supervised conditions. Alternatively, preparation for coursework may be set when required.
 - Cambridge Nationals core course - homework is set in preparation for the examination every other week.
 - GCSE Computing - one homework will be set per fortnight. This will be graded Red, Amber or Green on Go4Schools depending on whether the homework is completed to a poor, reasonable or good standard.
- Drama – one per fortnight
- English - homework will be set so that on average students will have an hour's worth of work each week; however, sometimes this will comprise longer pieces over several weeks and on occasions when students have no set written homework they will have reading set or work on spelling improvement.
- Ethics - ongoing scrap books to be kept up to date every week, with news and media events relating to the topics being studied for the exam. A practice exam question will be set once a half term following the completion of a topic. Students also have optional "stretch and challenge" homeworks they can choose to complete.
- History - homework will usually be research every 2 weeks during the Controlled Assessment period of the Autumn term, but after the January 'mock exams' it increases to every week during the revision period from February to May.
- Languages – For each modern language studied at GCSE, students are set two pieces of homework per week. One homework will be vocabulary learning on the "vocab express" website (www.vocabexpress.com), students have individual logins and passwords for this site. The other homework will vary between: reading or listening practice; written assignments; speaking preparation; exam practice.
- Latin - for Latin studied at KS4, students are set two pieces of homework per week. One homework will be vocabulary learning using the Cambridge Latin course website <http://www.cambridgescp.com>. The other homework will vary between: reading comprehension, translation, exam style questions or past papers.
- PE – no homework set for core. GCSE PE homework is set once a week, Vocational Sport homework is set at the teacher's discretion.
- Science – one homework per week, except for Triple Science students who will be set one homework per week for each of Biology, Chemistry and Physics.
- Study Plus – no homework set

Some additional information which you may find useful:

- Irrespective of whether a separate homework task is issued on a weekly basis, Science and D&T expect some work to be undertaken every week. This can include revision for module tests and work on Formally Assessed Tasks (Science).
- BTEC Dance homework is a mixture of written work and practice rehearsal
- Music homework may include either written/listening work or practical work on composition/performance coursework.
- There will be times when homework for all subjects will involve revision for mock and final GCSE exams.
